An opportunity to know science and spirituality of Vedic Havan with English explanation. The Vedic mantras recited during the Havan have a strong scientific significance related with everyday life. Children had an opportunity to directly participate in the Havan which was conducted by Professor Nawal Prinja. The event was attended by about 100 people including children.

Message from Prof. Nawal Prinja :-

Vedic havan yajna is often mistaken as a fire ritual or fire worship. The term 'yajna' literally means a creative process or action but this yajna that is performed by Hindus at all their sacraments has a totally different dimension. Hindu philosophy in the Vedas and Upanishads explains that the ultimate reality behind all the universe we see around us is one. The very basis of all creation, the very life force in all the living beings and the forces of nature that we observe are held by one holder of the power. That holder of the power is omnipresent, omniscient and omnipotent. We cannot see or hear or touch Him but He can see us all hear all and touch all. The process of havan yajna is to use the very forces of nature and the materials to try to connect to that Ultimate Reality. Outside the body it is called Brahman - inside the body it is called Atma. In summary, havan yajna is a creative process in reverse where the final output is used to go back to the very source of all creation
